

Note Regarding Authors' requests to re-use article content published or to be published in *Biometrics*

As part of IBS's publishing agreement with Blackwell, Blackwell administers and collects fees for all rights and permissions requests entailing re-use and re-publication of all or part of the articles published in *Biometrics*. Blackwell provides this service on IBS's behalf, and all of the income goes directly to the journal account for that year.

1. Non-*Biometrics* authors seeking to re-produce all or part of an article published in the journal need to submit a formal request for permission using the format specified on the Blackwell Permissions page for *Biometrics* at

2. *Biometrics* authors can use their own work without seeking Blackwell permission in the following instances provided that the author(s) give appropriate acknowledgement to IBS and Blackwell Publishing, as well as full bibliographic reference for the Article when it is published:

- The article or any part of it will not be sold or reproduced for commercial purposes by a third party (a party other than the original author).
- When all or part of the Article or abstract is to be used in a work in which the original author is the author or editor of the work.
- Use of the Article within the author's employer's institution or company for educational or research purposes, including use in course packs.
- Authors may post electronic versions (but not the Blackwell PDF) of their article on a personal website, their employer's website/repository, and on free public servers in their subject area, provided that there is a link to the published version of the article with the following text: 'The definitive version is available at www.blackwell-synergy.com'.

3. In the case where part or all of an author's work published in *Biometrics* is to be re-published in another publication, a formal permission request must be made if that publication is not edited by or written by the author him/herself.

If a *Biometrics* author finds themselves facing a strict deadline yet still needs to apply for Permission, they should email both the Blackwell Rights office (journalsrights@oxon.blackwellpublishing.com) and their Blackwell editorial or administrative contact (currently Amanda Chaloupka and/or Hilary Heindl) so that we may work towards an expedited grant of rights or a waiver.
